

First steps

What is a SIM card?

Every mobile phone requires a SIM card (Subscriber Identity Module) without the SIM card you cannot make calls. The SIM card is a microprocessor that stores your data and contacts. So handle the card with care and take care when inserting or removing it. Keep SIM cards out of the reach of small children.


Inserting the SIM card and micro SD card

- The phone must be switched off and disconnected from the charger.
- Remove the battery cover on the back of the phone by pressing the battery cover away with your fingernail in the notch at the bottom



If the battery is in the device, please remove it.

- 4. You can see 2 card holders: top right for the micro SD card and bottom right for the. NANO SIM card Carefully insert the SIM card into the SIM card slot. Ensure that the goldcoloured contacts of the card are facing downwards and the bevelled corner is on the left.
- Carefully insert the micro SD card into the SD micro SD card holder (2) and then lock it in place.



Inserting the battery

Align the gold-coloured contacts on the battery with the corresponding contacts on the phone.

- Press the other end of the battery until it clicks into place.
- Slide the battery cover down onto the device until it clicks into place.



Charging the battery

You have two options charging the battery of the *SL645 LTE:*

- Charging station
- B. Charger
- 1. Plug the charger connector into the phone.
- 2. Connect the charger to a mains socket.
- Charging the battery can take several hours. If the phone is charged when switched off, it will take a few seconds for the charging indicator to appear on the display.
- If the phone is charged when switched on, the battery indicator starts to rise. The battery is fully charged when the battery indicator no longer rises.
- Disconnect the charger from the mains and from the device when it is not in use!

Note: The battery should be charged for at least 12 hours first.

Switching the phone on or off:

Make sure that the SIM card is in the phone and the battery is charged.

1. Press the *red button* for 2-3 seconds to switch the phone on.

- If the PIN code is active, the phone will now ask for your PIN code, please enter it and confirm with OK.
- 3. Please select your language and confirm with *OK*.
- 4. Press the *red button* for 2-3 seconds to switch off the phone.

Without a SIM card, only the emergency number can be dialled.

Note: If the PIN code is entered incorrectly 3 times, the phone will ask for the PUK code, which you received together with the SIM card.

Standby

If you do not use the phone for a short time, the phone automatically switches to standby mode. Press any button to exit this mode.

Calls can be received in standby mode.

Headset/Bluetooth mode

If a headset is connected (including a Bluetooth headset), you can answer the call using the button on the headset.

Menu function

On the initial screen, press the left menu button

() to access the main menu and the right-hand menu button () to access the contacts.

Pressing the "Up arrow" button takes you to the *messages* and pressing the "Down arrow" button takes you to the *photo contacts*.

In some menus, you can navigate to the right and left using the $\it I$ and $\it II$ buttons.

Call functions

Call

 Enter the telephone number including the area code and press the green button. International calls: Enter a + sign before the area code by pressing* twice and the country (or regional) code. (Omit the 0 before the area code if necessary).

- Press the right-hand menu button Delete to delete the number to the left of the cursor.
- 3. Press the *green button* to call the number.

Calling using the phone book:

If contacts are saved in the phone book, you can make a call using the phone book.

- To access the phone book, press the 'right' menu button in the initial display.
- Use the up/down arrow to scroll to the desired telephone number.
- 3. Press the *green button* to call the number.
- 4. Press the *red button* to cancel or end the call.

Calling using the photo contacts

Press the *down arrow button* in the initial display.

Here you have the option of selecting up to 8 photo contacts, scroll to the desired photo contact using the *arrow buttons* and then press the *call button* (green button).

This picture appears in the photo contact directory. To assign a picture to this contact, carry out the following steps:

Create photo contact

- Press the arrow button (down) in the initial display to access the photo contact menu.
- Use the arrow keys to scroll.
- 3. To edit a photo contact, press the *left* menu button
- 4. Enter the names in the first line
- 5. Enter the telephone number in the first line
- 6. In the third line, press the *left menu button* "Options" and add a photo, you can select the following:
 - Select from album: Select an image that you have already saved.
 - b. From camera: Take a picture directly with the camera
- 7. After you have edited the contact, press the *right-hand menu button* (Back).
- 8. To save, confirm with the *left menu button* (Options) and confirm with *Save*.

Answering a call

When you receive a call and the phone rings or vibrates, you will see the number or name or even the picture on the display.

- If you want to answer the call, press the green button or OK.
- You also have the option of automatically answering the call by opening the phone, please go to the following menu item:

Settings- Call settings - **"Open answer flap"**, select *On* and press *OK*. If you wish to reject the call, press the *red button*.

3. You can switch the incoming call to silent using the side button.

Functions during a call:

The following functions are available to you by pressing the *Options* button during a call: Connect with Bluetooth headset*:

Establishes a connection to the headset.

New call:

To make another call.

Hold call:

Place the call in the queue.

Sound off:

Switch microphone off/on

Adjust the volume: Set the desired volume Contacts:

To access the phone book.

Messages:

To access the messages.

Hands-free operation:

You can activate/deactivate the hands-free function during a call by pressing the *right-hand menu button* (FSP.on).

Phone book

You can store up to 2000 phone numbers in your SL645 LTE phone. The SIM card has space for up to 250 phone numbers.

Access to your telephone numbers

You have two options for accessing the contacts:

- In home mode, press the right-hand menu button
- In home mode, press the left menu button, select Contacts and confirm with OK

Note: Symbolises a SIM card entry, Symbolises a telephone entry.

New contact

- 1. Press *Options* and select *Add contact* in the *Contacts* menu.
- 2. Select memory: SIM card or phone.

SIM memory: Only the name and number can be saved.

- 3. Phone memory: Name, number, home number and call tone can be saved.
- 4. To save the *contact*, press *Options* and *Save*.

Edit a contact:

- Select a name press Options and select Show
- Press Options and Edit and confirm with OK.
- Edit the entries to save the change press Options and select Save and confirm with OK

Delete contact from phone book or SIM card

- Select Main menu Phone book and press OK
- Select a contact and press OK
- Press Options
- 4. Select Delete and press OK
- Press OK once again to confirm the deletion.

Copy contact from phone book or SIM card

- Select Main menu Phone book and press OK
- Select a name press Options and select Show
- Press Options
- 4. Select Copy and press OK

Select the memory: SIM card or phone and press OK

Speed dialling

- Select Main menu Contacts and press OK
- Select Options and select Speed dialling and press OK

You can switch the speed dialling function on or off.

8 numbers can be stored as speed dialling numbers (2-9)

Press the desired number (2-9) for 2-3 seconds in the initial display and the assigned number is dialled.

Direct dialling numbers I - II (M1/M2)

- 1. Select Menu, Phone book and press OK
- 2. Select *Options* and select *M1/M2 Speed dialling* and press *OK*

Here you can edit the I and II numbers. By pressing the I or II button in outgoing mode, the SL645 LTE dials the stored telephone number.

Messaging

You can receive and send messages: SMS/MMS but this depends on your network operator. For more information, please contact your network operator.

Write messages

- 1. Select Menu, Messaging and press OK
- 2. Press write message

Text input

The following functions are available to you:

- Press 0 to add a space
- Press the * key to add special characters, use the "arrow", "I" and "II" keys to navigate to the desired symbols
- Press the arrow key to move the position indicator to the left or right.
- Press the right menu button (Delete) to delete a letter and hold down the right menu button (Delete) to delete the entire text.
- Press the # key to switch between lower and upper case:, DE, de, 123 or sDE, sde (smart input), pay attention to the symbol at the top right of the display.

Select recipient

Any number of contacts can be selected as recipients in the first field

Enter the message in the second field. Once you have completed the message, press *Options* and select *Send*.

SMS settings and MMS settings

Press the camera button in the message menu to call up further settings such as SMS settings or MMS settings or delete

Delete all messages

Press the camera button in the message menu to select the *Delete all* menu item.

Entrance

In this menu you can view the new or already read *messages*.

Depending on the mode, the phone vibrates or rings and the LED flashes when you receive a new *message* and in the home screen you will see this symbol on the display.

Press the *options* for the following functions:

Answer, Call sender, End again, Delete and Advanced.

Note: If the message memory is full, the symbol flashes in the initial display, please delete some messages to be able to receive new ones.

Output

Messages that have not been sent are saved in the *outbox*.

Drafts

You can see your saved messages in Drafts.

Messages sent

In this menu you can view *messages* that have already been sent. The following functions are available to you:

Forward, Delete, Use number, Copy to SIM* and Move to SIM card*.

*This option depends on where the SMS was saved.

Voicebox

The voice message is a network function. When a voice message is received, the display on your telephone shows that a new message has been received.

- Select Menu, Messages and press OK
- 2. Select *Voicebox* and press *OK*
- 3. Select 1.<blank> and press *Edit*.
- 4. Select Select or Edit
- If you select Edit, enter the number of your voicemail box.

In the home screen: Press and hold the number 1 and your phone will call the number stored in the *voicebox*.

Note: This service must be supported by the network operator.

Calls

Call list

Your phone saves lists for Missed Calls, Dialled Calls, and Received

The latest entries are at the top of the list. The following functions are available with this option:

Details, Call, Write message, Add contact,
Add to blacklist and Delete

Delete call list

Select Delete all to delete all logs.

Call time

The call times of the various calls are displayed here

GPRS counter

The data volumes of the MMS sent and received are displayed here.

Extras

Alarm clock

A maximum of 3 alarm clocks can be set. Setting the alarm clock:

- 1. Set the alarm clock: *On* or *Off* using the left menu button.
- 2. Select an alarm clock and press the camera button to edit it.

Enter the message, time, ringtone and repeat.

3. To save the alarm clock, press the left menu button OK at the menu item.

When the alarm sounds, press *Stop* to stop it or the *snooze* button. In this case, the alarm clock will snooze and sound again after approx. 10 minutes.

Calendar

- Select Menu, Extras and press OK
- 2. Select Calendar and press OK

Press the arrow buttons and I and II in the calendar interface to navigate to the desired days.

You can add tasks by pressing the *left menu button* (Options).

Notes

You can create notes here

Pocket calculator

This function allows you to use your mobile phone as a calculator. The calculator masters the basic arithmetic functions. Functions:

- Enter the numbers (1 to 0).
- Press # for the decimal point.
- Press the arrow buttons for +, -;
- Press the M buttons for x, ÷;
- Press the camera button for =

Press *OK* for the result, press and hold *Delete* for a new calculation task.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows you to connect your phone to a compatible Bluetooth device.

The following functions are available to you: *Bluetooth:*

Press the left menu button to switch the Bluetooth function on or off.

Visible

You can set your phone so that it can be recognised by other Bluetooth devices.

Recognised devices:

In this menu, you can establish a connection with Bluetooth devices that have already been recognised.

New audio device:

In this menu, you can establish a connection with Bluetooth-enabled audio accessories Change device name:

Change the Bluetooth device name.

Search Bluetooth audio device:

- 1. To start the search for another Bluetooth device, press *OK*.
- Select the desired device and press Pair.
- If a connection is established with another Bluetooth device, you will need a password. Confirm the password with OK.

You will find the following functions under Options: Connect, Rename, Delete and Delete all

World clock

- 1. In the main menu, select $\ensuremath{\textit{Extras}}$ and press $\ensuremath{\textit{OK}}$
- 2. Select *World clock* and press

Here you can display the capital cities with the corresponding times and set the summer time .

Camera

Press the camera button on the home screen to call up the camera function!

Photography

Aim the camera lens at a position or an object and press the camera button to take a photo. After the photo has been taken, it is shown on the display and saved automatically.

Important: To save multiple photos, please use a memory card (Micro SD up to 64 GB).

You can use *Options* to change the settings as follows:

More settings:

Here you have the option of setting several camera settings such as contrast and resolution, you can switch between the settings using buttons I and II

Photos:

Display the saved photos (in .jpg format). You can send and receive the photos via Bluetooth or MMS.

The following functions are available under Options: Display, Share, Use as wallpaper, Rename, Delete and Details.

To copy the pictures you have taken with the SL645 LTE camera to your computer, please proceed as follows:

- A menu then appears on the phone select "Removable storage device" and confirm with "OK"
- 3. The computer will recognise the phone as a removable storage device.
- You can now use Windows Explorer to edit the data as normal or copy it to the computer.

Settings

Display the profile mode list including: General, Silent, Conference, Indoors, Outdoors.

To activate the profile, select the desired profile and press the camera button.

Select the mode and call up the options menu:

Edit ringtones: Set ringtones and other tones as desired

Phone settings

1. Select Menu, Settings and press OK

2. Select *Phone settings* and press *OK* The following menu items are available:

Time and date

Set the time zone, date and time.

Language settings

You can set the display language in this menu

Quick button settings

Select quick access to your favourite functions.

Display settings

Setting the brightness and light duration of the display

Automatic switch on/off

Select the time when the phone should switch on or off.

Restore factory settings

You can use this function to reset the phone settings to the factory configuration.

You must enter the password to restore the factory settings. The default password is: 0000.

SOS

The SOS function is a simple function that can save lives at the crucial moment. You can save a total of 5 SOS contacts and one text message. These numbers, which you must first save in sequence, are dialled automatically in an emergency when you press the emergency call button on the back of the mobile phone. During the emergency call, a warning tone is emitted so that the person called knows that it is an emergency and an emergency text message is sent to all saved numbers! If the first number is not reached, the next number is dialled automatically and so on.

If no emergency number is saved or your phone card is empty or you are in a foreign network (e.g. roaming not activated), you can still dial 112 or other emergency numbers using the number keys.

If the SOS call is answered, the phone switches to hands-free mode.

Note:

 If you want to stop or cancel the emergency call, you must press the right-hand menu button or the SOS button. When using a prepaid card: Always ensure that you have sufficient credit on your prepaid card, as private emergency numbers cannot be dialled without sufficient credit.

Outside the home network of your network operator, you can usually still call the international emergency number 112.

Please note: If you wish to save emergency numbers such as rescue, police, fire brigade etc. as emergency numbers, you must clarify this with the respective institution beforehand. No liability will be accepted for any costs incurred if you call by mistake.

SOS

- 1. Select Menu, Settings and press OK
- 2. Select SOS settings and press OK

SOS status

You can switch the SOS button function on/off.

SOS Contacts

Decide on a maximum of 5 SOS numbers and their sequence.

SOS SMS

If the SOS call is started, this text is sent to the SOS numbers. The text can be changed as required.

SOS SMS Status

If the SOS call is started, the SOS SMS can optionally be activated or deactivated.

SOS Alarm tone

You can switch the SOS alarm tone on/off.

Call settings

- Select Menu, Settings and press OK
- 2. Select *Call settings* press *OK*Depending on the network operator

Depending on the network operator, you can use the following services:

Answers Open flap

Here you can set whether the incoming call is automatically accepted when the phone is opened.

Call forwarding

You can use this network service to divert incoming calls to another telephone number specified by you. It

several call diversions can be activated at the same time.

You will be informed during a call when another call comes in. Press "OK" or the left "Answer" menu button to answer the call. The first call remains on the other line; if you do not wish to answer the call, press the red end button.

Call barring

You can use this network service to restrict your calls

Caller identification

Here you can set whether your number is suppressed or visible to the called party.

Blacklist

Add phone numbers to the blacklist to block them.

Advanced settings

Call time reminder, automatic redialling, vibrate when connected, reply SMS, flight mode

Security settings

Select Menu, Settings and press OK

2. Select *Security settings* and press *OK* The following functions are available to you:

PIN

PIN lock: When switching the PIN request on or off, you will be prompted to enter the correct PIN code of the SIM card, you can change the PIN code of the SIM card at any time.

Phone lock:

Phone lock: When switching the PIN request on or off, you will be prompted to enter the correct phone password for the phone.

Change phone password: To change the password, enter the current password and then enter the new password twice.

- 2. Select *Connections* and press *OK* Depending on the network operator, you can use the following services:

Phone cannot be switched on:

- Check whether the PIN code has been entered correctly.

If the PIN code is entered incorrectly three times, the SIM card is blocked and you need the PUK code (please contact your network operator for your PUK code).

SIM card error:

- Is the contact area of the SIM card dirty?
 Clean the contact areas of the SIM card
- SIM card is not inserted correctly, insert the SIM card correctly.

 SIM card not working or damaged? Have the SIM card checked by your network operator.

Network connection cannot be established:

- Poor reception? Move to an open space or, if you are in a closed room, move close to the window.
- You are outside the range of the mobile phone network. Contact your network operator for information on network coverage.
- SIM card is invalid. Contact your network operator.

Poor voice quality:

- Poor network connection quality on the part of the network provider? Press the end button and dial again. You may be redirected to a network connection or telephone line with better quality.
- Poor quality of the local telephone line?
 Press the end button and dial again. You may be redirected to a network connection or telephone line with better quality.
- Try turning up the volume.

Outgoing calls cannot be made:

If you follow the suggestions below, you will prevent the warranty from expiring prematurely and you will be able to enjoy your product for many years to come.

 Please only use original accessories or accessories approved by the mobile phone manufacturer. The use of accessories without authorisation may result in poor performance, damage the phone or even harm your body and

- interfere with local telecommunications equipment.
- Please switch off the mobile phone before cleaning it. Use a damp or antistatic cloth, do not use chemicals or cleaning lotions that could damage the mobile phone.
- As the mobile phone can generate electromagnetic fields, you should never place it near magnetic objects such as a computer or hard drive.
- Interference is generated when the mobile phone is used in the vicinity of certain electronic devices, e.g. television, telephone, radio and computer.
- Never leave the mobile phone in the sun or in an environment with strong radiation, as high temperatures considerably shorten the service life of the electronic components.
- Always keep the mobile phone dry, as liquids could damage the circuitry.
- Never hit the phone anywhere with strong force and do not drop it. This type of force can damage the circuit.
- Please do not connect any incompatible devices to the phone.

- Do not attempt to disassemble the mobile phone or its battery.
- Do not store the mobile phone together with flammable or explosive material.
- Never attempt to charge the phone without first inserting the battery.
- Do not paint the phone. Paint can cause the moving parts to stick together and prevent proper operation.
- To disconnect the appliance from the mains, you must unplug the mains cable from the mains socket. You must therefore position the appliance in such a way that there is always unobstructed access to the mains socket so that you can unplug the mains plug immediately in an emergency. Battery

- Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery.
- Please note that a new battery only reaches its full capacity after it has been used for two or
- has been fully charged and discharged three times! Although the battery can be charged and discharged several hundred times, it will eventually wear out. If the operating time (talk and standby time) is significantly shorter than the normal operating time, you should buy a new battery.
- Disconnect the charger from the mains and from the device when it is not in use. If the battery is fully discharged, it may take a few minutes before the charging indicator appears on the display or you can make calls.
- Only use batteries and chargers that have been approved by the phone manufacturer. If you are not using the charger, unplug it from the mains socket. Do not leave the battery in the charger for longer than a week, as excessive charging can shorten its service life.

- When not in use, a fully charged battery discharges over time.
- Extreme temperatures have a detrimental effect on the performance of your battery.
- Only use the battery for its intended purpose. Do not use defective chargers or batteries.

Do not short-circuit the battery. An unintentional short circuit can occur if the positive and negative terminals of the battery are directly connected to each other by a metal object. Short-circuiting the terminals can damage the battery or the connecting object.

- Do not throw rechargeable batteries into a fireotherwise there is a risk of explosion! Batteries can also explode if they are damaged. Batteries must be disposed of properly

Road safety:

Operating environment:

Electronic devices:

Pacemaker:

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 20 cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are in line with independent research and the recommendations of Wireless Technology

Research. The following applies to people with a pacemaker:

- You should always maintain a minimum distance of 20 cm between the mobile phone and the pacemaker when the phone is switched on.
- You should not keep your phone in your breast pocket.
- You should use the ear furthest away from the pacemaker when making phone calls to minimise the risk of possible interference.
- If you have reason to suspect that a fault has occurred, switch off your telephone immediately.

Hearing aids:

Some digital mobile phones may cause interference with some hearing aids. In the event of such faults, you can contact the service provider.

Other medical devices:

Operation of a wireless device, including a mobile phone, may interfere with the operation of inadequately shielded medical devices. If you need information about adequately shielding a medical device from

external RF energy or have questions about other issues, consult a physician or the manufacturer of the medical device. Switch off your phone in healthcare facilities when instructed to do so by signs, notices or other written regulations. Hospitals or healthcare facilities may use equipment that may be sensitive to external RF energy

Places labelled accordingly:

Places labelled accordingly: Switch off your phone wherever corresponding prompts are displayed.

Potentially explosive atmospheres:

Switch off your phone in potentially explosive atmospheres and act in accordance with the signs and instructions. In such places, a spark can trigger an explosion or cause a fire in which you could be injured or even killed. Users are advised to switch off the phone at petrol stations.
